





Job Description

Foreign language instructors teach languages that are spoken primarily in other countries. French, Japanese, Italian, Arabic, Russian, Mandarin Chinese, German, and Hindi, are just a few examples of these languages. Students or clients of foreign language instructors can include everyone from young children, to businesspeople and diplomats who want to work in other countries.

Like other teachers, foreign language instructors prepare lesson plans, assignments, and other materials. They teach classes, run discussion groups, and supervise classroom activities. They also evaluate assignments and examinations. Because their clients are often very new to the language, instructors spend a great deal of time cleaning up students' errors.
